



High Point Program rules

Categories – Champion and Reserve are awarded:

Over-All High Point, Youth and Adult

1. Only sound Walking horses and Spotted Saddle horses will be considered for High Point awards.
2. Participant must be a member prior to or on the date of the event.
3. Points are calculated based on a horse/rider combination. The exception is the Academy division which is calculated only by the rider.
4. Points from all horse shows sponsored by PPWHANC count toward high points in their respective divisions. First place gets six points; second place gets five points; third place gets four points; fourth place gets three points; fifth place gets two points and sixth place gets one point.
5. Country Pleasure, Racking and Academy points are awarded for registered and unregistered horses.
6. Trail Pleasure, Lite Shod, Plantation Shod, Versatility and Over-All High Point points are awarded to registered Walking Horses only.
7. Spotted Saddle Horse points are awarded only to horses double registered as Walking Horses & Spotted Saddle Horses.
8. Academy classes will count toward Academy High Points ONLY.
9. Versatility points include such classes as trail obstacle, model, showmanship, equitation (English and Stock Seat), western riding, reining, poles, barrels, driving, water glass, jumping and dressage. Other classes may be included as defined by the TWHBEA Versatility Program rules.
10. Points in the following divisions count toward Over-All High Point:

Versatility Youth	Versatility Adult
- Racking, Spotted Saddle Horse and Academy classes DO NOT count toward Over-All High Point.
11. Academy, Versatility and Over-All Championship ties will be broken on the basis of total equitation and/or horsemanship points earned. If a tie still exists, the contestant with the most points in the showmanship classes will be declared the champion. If a tie still exists, the exhibitor who places in the greater number of classes will be declared the champion.
12. Rail class division (such as Country Pleasure, Trail Pleasure, Lite Shod, Plantation Shod, Spotted Saddle Horse and Racking) ties will be broken on the basis of the exhibitor who places in the greater number of classes will be declared the champion.
13. The PPWHANC Board of Directors reserves the right to designate any show as a multiple point show.
14. All recipients of awards will be contacted prior to awards presentation.
